Introduction

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under Sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of the registered early years provision. 'Early years provision' refers to provision regulated by Ofsted for children from birth to 31 August following their fifth birthday (the early years age group). The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and welfare, known as the *Early Years Foundation Stage*.

The report includes information on any complaints about the childcare provision which Ofsted has received since the last inspection or registration whichever is the later, which require Ofsted or the provider to take action in Annex C.

The provider must provide a copy of this report to all parents with children at the setting where reasonably practicable. The provider must provide a copy of the report to any other person who asks for one, but may charge a fee for this service (The Childcare (Inspection) Regulations 2008 regulations 9 and 10).

Children only attend this setting before and/or after the school day and/or during the school holidays. The judgements in this report reflect the quality of early years provision offered to children during those periods.

The setting also makes provision for children older than the early years age group which is registered on the voluntary and/or compulsory part(s) of the Childcare Register. This report does not include an evaluation of that provision, but a comment about compliance with the requirements of the Childcare Register is included in Annex B.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states if the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Description of the setting

Cared 4 Club was registered in 1999. It is a privately owned provision that offers out of school care and is based in the grounds of William Lilley Infant School in Stapleford. The club has use of a portacabin as its main base, with additional areas in the school if needed. Children use the enclosed playground and school field for outside play. Children from a number of local schools attend this provision. The club is registered to accept a maximum of 70 children at any one time. There are currently 157 children aged from five to 14 years on roll, 50 of whom are under eight years and 107 between eight and 14 years. The setting is registered on the Early Years Register and both parts of the Childcare Register. Currently there are no children in the early years age group on roll.

Children have different patterns of attendance, with some only attending during school holidays. The club is open daily from 07:30 to 09:00 and 15:00 to 18:00 during school term times and from 07:30 to 18:00 in the school holidays. A total of seven staff work with the children, five of whom hold relevant early years qualifications. There is appropriate disability access.

Overall effectiveness of the early years provision

This is an inclusive setting where the staff work hard to meet the individual needs of all the children. Parents value its warm and caring atmosphere, where children play together through a range of well-planned activities. Children feel safe because of the security systems which are in place and the high expectations for behaviour. A range of thoughtful routines and arrangements are in place which ensures communication with the busiest of parents and between the setting and its partner schools. The way in which the setting reviews itself and brings about improvement, is changing to one which is becoming more widely used.
