

#### Inspection report for early years provision

**Type of setting** Childminder

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#### Introduction

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under Sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of the registered early years provision. 'Early years provision' refers to provision regulated by Ofsted for children from birth to 31 August following their fifth birthday (the early years age group). The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and welfare, known as the *Early Years Foundation Stage*.

The report includes information on any complaints about the childcare provision which Ofsted has received since the last inspection or registration whichever is the later, which require Ofsted or the provider to take action in Annex C.

The provider must provide a copy of this report to all parents with children at the setting where reasonably practicable. The provider must provide a copy of the report to any other person who asks for one, but may charge a fee for this service (The Childcare (Inspection) Regulations 2008 regulations 9 and 10).

The setting also makes provision for children older than the early years age group which is registered on the voluntary and/or compulsory part(s) of the Childcare Register. This report does not include an evaluation of that provision, but a comment about compliance with the requirements of the Childcare Register is included in Annex B.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states if the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

# **Description of the childminding**

The childminder was registered in 1999. She lives with her husband and four-yearold twins in the Barking area of the London borough of Newham. The whole of the ground floor of the childminder's house is used for childminding and there is a fully enclosed garden for outside play.

The childminder is registered to provide care for a maximum of four children under eight years at any one time. She is also registered by Ofsted on the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. At the time of the inspection, there were no children on roll.

# Overall effectiveness of the early years provision

The childminder meets the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. This is because she understands the need to plan and provide a broad and varied curriculum that identifies and meets the needs of individual children. The childminder demonstrates an understanding of her responsibilities to safeguard children and to promote their welfare. Although a first aid course has recently been completed, evidence of this was not available for inspection. Procedures for sharing information with parents and other agencies are suitable. Records and documentation required for the safe and effective management of the setting are available to use when children attend. Further training and systems for self-evaluation ensure the capacity to maintain continuous improvement is sound.
