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## Introduction

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under Sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of the registered early years provision. 'Early years provision' refers to provision regulated by Ofsted for children from birth to 31 August following their fifth birthday (the early years age group). The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and welfare, known as the *Early Years Foundation Stage*.

The provider must provide a copy of this report to all parents with children at the setting where reasonably practicable. The provider must provide a copy of the report to any other person who asks for one, but may charge a fee for this service (The Childcare (Inspection) Regulations 2008 regulations 9 and 10).

Children only attend this setting before and/or after the school day and/or during the school holidays. The judgements in this report reflect the quality of early years provision offered to children during those periods.

The setting also makes provision for children older than the early years age group which is registered on the voluntary and/or compulsory part(s) of the Childcare Register. This report does not include an evaluation of that provision, but a comment about compliance with the requirements of the Childcare Register is included in Annex B.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states if the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Description of the setting**

Cottingham Kids Club opened in 2000. It operates from two rooms, a large hall and a smaller meeting room, within the Zion Church Hall in Cottingham. It serves children from two local schools. There is an enclosed area available for outside play.

The club is registered on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There are currently 26 children on roll who attend for a variety of sessions although none are in the Early Years Foundation Stage age group. The club opens Monday to Friday from 07.30 to 08.50 and 15.30 to 18.00 during term time. During school holidays it opens from 07.30 to 17.30.

There are three members of staff who work with the children, two of whom hold relevant childcare qualifications.

## **The overall effectiveness of the early years provision**

The provider demonstrated through discussion and documentation that she organises the day to day running of the out of school club appropriately to support most children's learning and development and welfare needs. She has addressed all actions raised at the last visit. She holds a valid first aid certificate and takes appropriate actions when incident occur. She understands her responsibilities with regard to safeguarding children and has written policies to support her practice. Although the provider and her staff talk to parents each day regarding the children's care, activities and opportunities, she does not, however, share possible future plans regarding the club with them immediately. The provider ensures rooms used by the children are safe and any concerns are reported to the church committee in order to minimised hazards. An inclusive environment is provided for children, although the range of toys, resources and play materials currently only meet the needs of older children.
