Ofsted 2010–11 best practice survey: safeguarding in colleges

Thank you for your hospitality and cooperation, and that of your staff, during my visit on 13 October 2010 to look at your provision for safeguarding students.

The visit provided valuable information which will contribute to our publication about best practice in safeguarding in colleges. The publication will include case studies about individual providers. If City of Sunderland College is included as a case study, you will have an opportunity to comment on the text prior to publication. Individual institutions will not be identified in the main text without their consent.

Features of good practice

- Well-established and highly effective safeguarding arrangements to ensure learners' safety and well-being which are implemented across a large general further education college based over five separate city-based college sites and which caters for a highly diverse community of learners.
- High priority given to safeguarding of learners by all staff, reinforced by senior managers and governors with a relentless focus on supporting and safeguarding individual students well.
- Comprehensive and thorough procedures for the selection and recruitment of staff and for undertaking and recording safeguarding checks on all the people who work at or are involved with the college.
- Longstanding and strong links with numerous external welfare and support specialist agencies, including actively encouraging productive information sharing and developing ways of effective working.

- A strong focus on health and safety education to promote safeguarding and encourage students to take responsibility for their own and others' safety.
- Thorough and comprehensive bespoke staff training which takes place regularly for all staff and governors. Training materials are developed inhouse and contextualised to the college's setting and use college-based examples to ensure relevance and effectiveness.

I hope that these observations are useful as you continue to develop safeguarding provision in the college.
