Context of the inspection

This inspection was undertaken at the request of the registration authority for independent schools in order to monitor the progress the school has made in implementing its action plan. The last inspection of Abacus College took place on 1 and 2 May 2013. The action plan was accepted on 5 July 2013. This is the first visit to the school to follow up its progress.

Summary of the progress made in implementing the action plan

Regulations not met

Quality of curriculum

The college has not ensured that all curriculum areas are supported by appropriate plans and schemes of work. This is because the schemes of work for art, drama and physical education (PE) lack sufficient detail for immediate implementation should the need arise. In contrast, the college has made good progress with its plans and schemes of work for history. The planned weekly timetable for students of compulsory school age is appropriate and covers all the required areas of learning.

Good progress has been made in implementing the college's action plan related to the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of students. There is an appropriately planned programme of personal, social and health education (PSHE) to promote personal development.

Good progress has been made in preparing students for adult life. Plans have been initiated to ensure all students are more involved in the community life of the college and Headington. This includes voluntary work in a local charity shop and having a greater voice through the imminent development of an elected student council. The adaptation of a politics course has the capacity to give all students the opportunity to learn about life in Britain and to learn about mutual respect and tolerance in a coherent way.

Welfare, health and safety of students

The college has not ensured that the single central record (SCR) shows that all of the appropriate checks have been made on all staff. Progress has been too slow on obtaining confirmation on all staff who have worked abroad of good conduct from the police service in the country where they were residing. However, good progress has been made in ensuring that all staff have either had a criminal record check or have not been barred from working with children whilst residing in the United Kingdom. This is now effectively recorded on an updated SCR and the safer recruitment policy has been updated to reflect

the additional checks needed.

Good progress has been made in ensuring all staff have received appropriate training in child protection. The college has also increased the number of trained first aiders and ensured that the first aid policy has all the information required.

Compliance with regulatory requirements

The school requires improvement and must take action to meet The Education (Independent School Standards) (England) Regulations 2010 ('the Regulations'), and associated requirements

Ensure that all curriculum areas are supported by appropriate plans and schemes 2(1) of work.

Ensure that the curriculum for compulsory school age pupils gives experience of the humanities and aesthetic and creative activities.

Ensure that the college can verify, where appropriate, that staff who have lived 19(2)(d) outside the United Kingdom are suitable to work with children.

Ensure that the single central register shows that appropriate checks have been 22(3) made on all appointed staff after 1 May 2007.
