Outcome of monitoring visit for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Sarah Haylett, carried out a monitoring visit of your provision on 30/09/2013. This visit follows on from your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of the visit

As a result of our inspection on 12/07/2013, we sent you a welfare requirements notice.

The welfare requirements notice required you to:

- ensure the premises are fit for purpose so that spaces are safe for children to use with no access to harmful substances and upstairs windows are secure;
- ensure that risk assessments identify all aspects of the environment that need to be checked on a regular basis and how the risk will be removed or minimised; and
- ensure that all staff receive induction training that helps them to understand their roles and responsibilities, including about safety issues.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that at this time the setting is making good improvement overall.

Overall effectiveness of the improvement and outcomes for children

A monitoring visit was carried out on 30 September 2013 and you had made good progress since the inspection.

There are restrictors in place on the windows upstairs and areas such as the cleaning cupboard are kept locked when children are present. The risk assessments have been reviewed and all staff have contributed to this process. Staff complete safety

sweeps of all areas of the premises each day and the outcome of these sweeps is recorded. Additionally the manager and deputy manager complete random checks to ensure the safety sweeps have been completed robustly and that all risks have been identified and measures have been taken to minimise or eliminate the identified risk.

All new staff complete an induction and this includes training in completing the safety sweeps. The induction is signed off by the manager.

Ofsted will carry out a full inspection.

Next steps

Having considered all the evidence the inspector is of the opinion that at this time:

- The setting has made good improvement. The next visit will be a full inspection.
