## The quality and standards of the early years provision

## The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to meet children's individual learning needs through observation, assessment and the planning of activities that reflect their interests.
- The childminder is well-organised and demonstrates a good understanding of the requirements and has clear policies to support her knowledge. She has completed a range of courses and continues to attend regular training so that she can improve her practice.
- The childminder offers a welcoming and safe environment, and describes how children are appropriately supervised and are not left with persons, who have not been appropriately vetted.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrated how she would organise suitable play opportunities to meet the individual needs of children and to ensure the environment supported their learning and development needs.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge of safeguarding so as to protect children in her care. She has a clear understanding of managing behaviour, to ensure children develop confidence and self-esteem.

## Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector sampled records and documentation relating to obtaining children's starting points, policies and procedures and contracts.
- The inspector observed the areas that children would have access to along with resources and equipment that would be used.
- The inspector viewed training certificates and documentation pertaining to the childminder's suitability.

# Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 1996 on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her husband and twins aged three years, in Loughborough, Leicestershire. Her home is within walking distance of the local schools, shops and parks. The whole of the ground floor of the childminder's house is used for childminding purposes. There is an enclosed rear garden, which is accessible to children.

The childminder has a level 3 qualification in childcare. She visits the local shops and park on a regular basis. She collects children from the local schools and pre-schools.

There are currently no children on roll in the early years age range. She is open all year round from 7am to 7pm Monday to Friday, except for family holidays.

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#### Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.
