#### **Reason for inspection**

A complaint was received at the Department for Education concerning pupils' health, welfare and safety. In response, the Department commissioned Ofsted to undertake an unannounced emergency inspection to look at the issues raised in the complaint.

#### **Conclusions**

Arrangements made to safeguard and promote the welfare of pupils at the school including those for the promotion of good behaviour and anti-bullying are adequate. Some aspects of record keeping do not consistently reflect the good quality of written policies for safeguarding and child protection, health and safety (including arrangements for educational visits), first aid, behaviour and anti-bullying. The school is addressing this as a matter of urgency by developing official forms for all aspects of record keeping relating to pupils' health, welfare and safety.

Arrangements for health and safety are variable in quality overall. The school has a comprehensive written policy that complies with health and safety laws but it is not implemented consistently with sufficient rigour and regard to detail. Standards are not met fully and require improvement as HMI found some inadequacies in the safety and security arrangements of the school site. The hot water in washrooms is too hot for pupils' safety. Sources for drinking water are not labelled as required. Two windows on the upper floor were locked but are without restraints for when the windows are opened in warm weather. Similarly, low-level ground floor windows facing the road are unrestrained if unlocked and opened.
