Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Sarah Gilpin, monitored your provision on 10/02/2014 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of monitoring

As a result of our inspection on 11/11/2013, we sent you a notice to improve. The actions you were set are included at the end of this letter.

During the monitoring visit the inspector discussed with you the steps you have taken to address the actions raised in the notice to improve. She observed practice and had a discussion with the nominated person. The inspector also spoke to two members of staff. She looked at your safeguarding policy and procedures, records of staff training, staff evaluations of the training and the new documentation for recording children's existing injuries.

The inspector found that you have developed a comprehensive action plan to address the issues raised at the last inspection and sought input from the local authority as well as other professionals working to safeguard children.

As a result of a training day attended by the staff team in January 2014, staff have a thorough understanding of their role in protecting children from the risk of harm. Staff understand the policy and procedures the nursery have in place to safeguard children, they know what signs and symptoms might cause concern and they know who to contact to refer any such concerns about a child in the nursery.

Staff work in partnership with parents and effectively implement the new system to encourage parents to share information about any injuries their child may have sustained when not at nursery. The new existing injury form is used by staff and as a result, a record is kept of such injuries.

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You are working in partnership with parents and have planned a training event for them at the end of February 2014, to share with them strategies to manage their children's behaviour. The policy and procedures the nursery have are shared with parents.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the setting has taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

Next steps

The next step will be a full inspection.
