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Service information

Brief description of the service

This is a privately owned children's home. The home is currently registered to provide care and accommodation for up to eight children with emotional and behavioural difficulties.

Progress

The home has been closed since October 2012. The registered provider has indicated that the home will not be operational for another five months. Should the home decide to accept placements the registered provider is required to inform Ofsted of their intention before they do so.

There is no current registered manager or staff team. The registered provider is aware that prior to re-opening a registered manager would need to be in place along with plans for the recruitment and induction of a new staff team.

The home remains habitable. Bedrooms and communal rooms are generally in suitable decorative order. Gas, electrical and fire safety equipment has been regularly checked and maintained keeping the physical environment safe.

As no children and young people have lived in the home for over a year there is no progress judgement made as part of this inspection.

About this inspection

The purpose of this inspection is to assure children and young people, parents, the public, local authorities and government of the quality and standard of the service provided. The inspection was carried out under the Care Standards Act 2000 to assess the effectiveness of the service and to consider how well it complies with the relevant regulations and meets the national minimum standards.
