## Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Lynn Hughes, monitored your provision on 01/04/2014 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

## **Outcome of monitoring**

As a result of our inspection on 10/12/2013, we sent you a notice to improve. The actions you were set are included at the end of this letter.

During the monitoring visit the inspector discussed with you the steps you have taken to address the actions raised in the notice to improve. She observed activities in the nursery and in the nursery garden and had a discussion with the manager, practitioners and children. The inspector also spoke to yourself and to two representatives from the local authority. She looked at documentation relating to the changes you have made since your last inspection. The inspector also looked at records to evidence the suitability of practitioners, she looked at children's personal details, information about planning and assessment, accident and medication records, the daily attendance register, proof of qualifications, including first aid and written policies.

The inspector found that you have developed an action plan to address the issues raised at your last inspection and have implemented more effective systems for monitoring and reviewing the provision. This has enabled you to identify how to address the areas for improvement and to plan for ongoing improvements.

The inspector found that you have reviewed and reflected upon the way in which you plan for children's learning, especially for the younger children attending the nursery. You have worked effectively with representatives from the local authority to implement a more rigorous system for observing children's progress and planning challenging activities for each child. As part of this review, you have also considered

your environment and implemented a number of changes to the organisation of both the baby room and the older children's room. This has resulted in children being able to more effectively guide their own learning and make choices over their play. You now provide children with greater opportunities to express themselves creatively through a range of resources, activities and materials. You are currently developing the outdoor area, to reflect the changes indoors. You have provided more role play equipment outdoors and ensure that children have opportunities to explore all seven areas of learning. At present you are not making full use of the outdoor area, for example, children are not always able to choose when to play outdoors, however, plans to fully implement this are in hand.

The inspector found that you have implemented systems to enable you to more effectively involve parents in their children's learning. You have reviewed the 'all about me' booklets you use and are now offering these more consistently across all age groups within the nursery. Parents are provided with greater opportunities to share their views on their children's learning as key persons now provide more opportunities for verbal discussions as well as open events to encourage parents to visit the setting and discuss their children's ongoing development. Systems for ensuring that parents are always kept well-informed of any accidents or injuries to a child have been tightened. You now have a clear log book in which you record all telephone calls to parents and practitioners have been reminded of the nursery's procedures for dealing with accidents.

During the monitoring visit, the inspector observed practitioners demonstrating their understanding of their roles and responsibilities and taking control of everyday routines. For example, while the inspector was holding a meeting with the manager and yourself, practitioners followed the routine and organised the key person groups and end of session story time. The manager has improved her systems for organising the practitioner rota and now keeps clear spreadsheets showing which children are due in each day and how many practitioners are required to meet the correct adult to child ratio. A re-organisation of practitioners working with each age group has resulted in more effective deployment of practitioners and a sharper focus of on the experience and skill of the practitioners supervising children.

The inspector found that children are more effectively protected from harm, because you have put in place safeguarding training for all practitioners, to ensure that they have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues and that they know what to do if they have a concern about a child. This training was delivered in-house, by a representative of the local authority development team. You are continuing to review practitioner's safeguarding knowledge through regular supervision and appraisal meetings.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the setting has taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

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## **Next steps**

The next step will be a full inspection.
