The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision does not meet requirements

- The inspection was prioritised by Ofsted following information received in March 2014 regarding the general suitability of the provider. It was found during the inspection that some committee members have not cooperated in completing their Disclosure and Barring Service checks. As a result, children's safety is compromised.
- Practitioners lack the training, some teaching skills and knowledge to deliver the educational programmes effectively with particular regard to the seven areas of learning. This means that children's progress is likely to be below what might usually be expected.
- Partnerships with parents work well. This is because the practitioners keep parents informed of activities their children have participated in and encourage them to be actively involved in the club activities, such as fundraising to improve toys and resources for the children.
- Children benefit from regular opportunities to enjoy time outside in the fresh air while exercising.
- There is a key person system in place and the manager can demonstrate how the links with parents ensure children's care needs are met and any ongoing issues are addressed sensitively.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the manager and practitioners at appropriate times
 throughout the inspection regarding how they intend to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector took account of the views of parents.

The inspector sampled a selection of documentation, including suitability checks, safeguarding procedures, performance management and monitoring records, children's development and personal records, self-evaluation record, planning documentation, written policies, and how these will be used caring for children.

Information about the setting

All Hallows Kabin (O.O.S.C) was registered in 2001 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. It is situated in a building within the grounds of All Hallows Primary School in the Gedling area of Nottingham, and is managed by a voluntary management committee. The club serves the local area and is accessible to all children. There are several enclosed areas available for outdoor play. There were no children present at the time of the inspection. The nursery employs nine members of childcare staff. Of these, three hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3, two at level 2 and 4 are unqualified. The club opens Monday to Friday term time between 7.45am to 8.50am and 3.20pm to 6pm. The club also operates during most school holidays between the hours of 7.45am to 6pm. The club is closed during all public bank holidays and for two weeks during the Christmas holiday. Children attend for a variety of sessions. There are currently 64 children attending, of these, six attend who are in the early years age group.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

- ensure all committee members obtain enhanced criminal records checks and barred list checks
- increase teaching skills, knowledge and understanding in order to deliver the learning and development requirements effectively. This is with particular regard to the seven areas of learning to ensure that all children benefit from learning experiences so that they make good progress.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
