## The quality and standards of the early years provision

### The provision does not meet requirements

- Staff caring for the children do not have an appropriate paediatric first aid qualification. Therefore, young children's safety in the event of an accident cannot be assured. This means the provider is not meeting a legal requirement of the Early Years Foundation Stage or the requirements of the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register.
- Children are taught by staff who have a satisfactory knowledge and understanding of how children learn and develop and who effectively support children's learning to ensure they make progress.
- Children are cared for by staff who have a secure knowledge of child protection procedures and fully understand their responsibility to protect the welfare of children in their care.
- Children's well-being is promoted as they form close attachments to staff as a result of the recently introduced key person system and the improved arrangements for managing children's behaviour.
- The manager demonstrates a commitment to improve the quality of the provision for children. For example, recent links made with the host school ensure continuity of care and learning.

## Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed areas of the premises and the garden used by children.
- The inspector looked at evidence of suitability and qualifications of staff members and a range of other documentation, including safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector discussed with the manager how they deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector discussed with the provider their self-evaluation form and improvement plan.

## Full report

### Information about the setting

Les Enfants@ Claydon Primary School was registered in 2007 on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. It operates from the nursery area within the Claydon Primary School in Ipswich, Suffolk. The out of school club is privately owned. The club serves the local area and is accessible to all children. Children have access to two large playrooms and an enclosed area for outdoor play. The club employs two members of childcare staff. Of these, both hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 2 and level 5. The club opens Monday to Friday during school term times. Sessions are from 3.20pm until 6.20pm. Children attend for a variety of sessions. There are currently three children on roll who are in the early years age group. At the time of inspection there were no children in the early years present.

### What the setting needs to do to improve further

#### To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

- ensure at least one person who holds a current, local authority approved, paediatric first-aid qualification is present at every session and during outings.

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## Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
