The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The out of school club successfully identifies risks within the environment, and takes appropriate action to minimise these. Children are safeguarded because the staff are aware of their responsibility to protect them.
- Staff have an appropriate awareness of how to promote the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are able to plan for the children's individual learning needs and complete observational assessments, in partnership with teachers and parents, in order to track children's progress.
- The out of school club provides a variety of resources and activities that challenge children's abilities in line with their age and stage of development.
- The out of school club's manager and staff have a sound knowledge of child protection procedures approved by the Local Safeguarding Children Board, and are aware of their responsibilities to protect the welfare of the children in their care.
- The out of school club's staff have an appropriate understanding of the need to develop strong partnerships with parents, taking into account their differing views and the needs of their children. As a result, children's well-being is suitably fostered and they settle in quickly.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the provider how they intend to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the provider uses when caring for children.
- The inspector looked at documents and discussed issues relating to the management of safeguarding children within their care.
- The inspector looked around the areas of the setting that are used during operational hours.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and qualifications of practitioners working with children, the provider's self-evaluation and improvement plan.

Information about the setting

Fleckney Out of School Club registered in 2007. It operates from the main school hall within Fleckney Church of England Primary School. The club also has access to a classroom, computer suite, school library, playing fields and associated facilities. The club currently has 85 children on roll, none of whom are within the early years age group. The club opens five days a week during school term time. A breakfast club runs from 8.am until 8.50 am and after school sessions run from 3.05 pm to 5.30 pm. Children attend for a variety of sessions. There are seven members of staff, five of whom hold relevant qualifications level 3. Six have certificates for paediatric first aid and food hygiene. Five work in the main school as teaching assistants. The club is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
