The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The provider has a clear understanding and knowledge of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. Children's development is assessed appropriately because staff find out about their starting points. They carry out observations and take photographs to monitor children's progress.
- The provider and other staff have a clear understanding and up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding and how to promote children's safety and protect them from harm.
- The provider demonstrates a sound understanding of how to promote consistent care for children through positive partnerships with parents and the local schools.
- The provider and her staff understand how to promote children's healthy lifestyles. They demonstrate that they provide children with healthy choices of snacks, daily opportunities for fresh air, exercise and positive hygiene procedures.
- The provider demonstrates a clear commitment to making continuous improvements to the service through the self-evaluation and ongoing training for all staff.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Information about the setting

Kids Company Out of School Club was registered in 2011 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. It is situated in Runwell Primary School in the Runwell area of Wickford, Essex and is privately owned and managed. The club serves the local area and is accessible to all children. It operates from two classrooms, the school hall and the school's playgrounds and fields for outdoor play. The nursery employs nine members of childcare staff. Of these, five hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3 and above. The club operates a breakfast club from 7.30am until 8.50am and then after school from 3pm until 6.15pm, during term time. During the school holidays, the club operates from 7.30am until 6.15pm, Monday to Friday. Children attend for a variety of sessions. There are currently 80 children attending, of whom 10 are in the early years age group. At the time of the inspection, no early years children were present.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
