The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good awareness of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She appropriately demonstrates how she will enhance learning opportunities to meet the children's individual needs and work in partnership with the parents, other providers and schools to complement children's individual care and learning needs.
- Through discussion the childminder demonstrates how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children. She has policies and documents in place that she intends to use when caring for children and she demonstrates a good understanding of self-evaluation and improvement plans.
- The childminder has good knowledge of safeguarding and understands her duty to protect children. She can recognise signs of abuse and neglect and knows the correct procedure to follow should she have concerns about a child in her care. She understands how to complete risk assessments and minimise identified risks to children.
- The childminder demonstrates her awareness of how to promote children's understanding of a healthy lifestyle and diet by providing a choice of healthy snacks and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise in the garden and through visiting local parks. She also understands how to positively manage a broad range of children's behaviour.
- The childminder has implemented the recommendations set at the last inspection. This has resulted in improved systems of self-evaluation and risk assessment. This has also resulted in improved recording of children's arrival and departure times within the setting. This demonstrates the provider's capacity to improve and to further develop the provision.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector and childminder toured the areas of the premises where childcare is to be provided.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed and looked at toys, books, resources and equipment that she intends to use in the indoor and outdoor areas.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children and discussed the self-evaluation and improvement plans.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and training of the childminder and suitability of other persons living on the premises.
- The inspector took account of the views of parents and children who have previously attended the childminder's provision.

Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 1984 on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her husband in a house in the Royton area of Oldham. The childminder uses the lower ground floor and an enclosed rear garden for childminding. The family have a pet dog. There were no children on roll at the time of the inspection. The childminder is open all year round, from 7.30am to 5pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays.

Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

The Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted) regulates and inspects to achieve excellence in the care of children and young people, and in education and skills for learners of all ages. It regulates and inspects childcare and children's social care, and inspects the Children and Family Court Advisory Support Service (Cafcass), schools, colleges, initial teacher training, work-based learning and skills training, adult and community learning, and education and training in prisons and other secure establishments.
