Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Rebecca Hurst, monitored your provision on 05/09/2014 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of monitoring

As a result of our inspection on 02/06/2014, we sent you a notice to improve. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

During the monitoring visit the inspector discussed with you the steps you have taken to address the actions raised in the notice to improve. The inspector looked at your systems for recording Disclosure and Barring Service checks and for carrying out first aid training. She also reviewed staff qualifications and your arrangements for the supervision and appraisals for staff. The inspector spoke with you about your action plans and the steps you have taken to make improvements.

The inspector found that you are addressing the issues raised at your last inspection in order to make improvements to the service you provide. As a result, you have been able to identify in your action plan how you intend to improve, and how you will maintain these improvements.

The inspector viewed the Disclosure and Barring Service checks that have been received for some staff. You have not recorded this information for all staff yet, which is a requirement and must include the disclosure reference number, the date the disclosure was obtained and details of who obtained it. Disclosure and Barring checks have now been initiated for all staff, although you are awaiting the return of some checks. You state that these staff are not left unsupervised with children, which helps to keep them safe. Three staff now hold current first-aid certificates and another member of staff has first-aid training booked to attend shortly. This supports children's health safety and well-being.





Two staff members of staff are currently undertaking appropriate level three qualifications and are nearing completion of this training. In addition, you are planning that another member of staff attends training to gain a recognised qualification. These measures reflect that you are taking the necessary steps to meet the requirements for staffing qualifications. You have begun to carry out supervision meetings with the staff, although this is still in its infancy. This is helping you to identify the support staff need to carry out their roles. In addition, you plan to give staff individual responsibilities at the setting. These measures will help develop the quality of staff practice at the club, which will benefit children.

You have shown a positive approach to the changes required. Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that at this time you have taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.
