The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- Through discussion and review of supporting documentation, the provider demonstrates a sound understanding of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. There are procedures in place that support observation, assessment and planning in order to offer appropriate learning opportunities to meet children's individual needs.
- The provider demonstrates how the setting promotes children's safety and welfare. For example, she makes sure that risk assessments are reviewed regularly and daily safety checks are carried out. This ensures that the environment is safe and secure for children to use.
- The provider has procedures and paperwork in place that support the setting in obtaining information from parents. These procedures include home visits for each child. This means that staff are able to access the information they need in order to understand and meet children's individual care and learning needs.
- The provider shows a clear understanding of how to promote children's well-being. She demonstrates that the setting offers children a healthy range of snacks and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise. She also ensures that she offers staff support and training in managing children's behaviour in a positive manner.
- Through discussion and the provision of relevant documents and policies, the provider demonstrates that she and her staff have an appropriate knowledge of child protection procedures. Records show that staff attend regular training and so understand their responsibility to protect the welfare of children in their care.
- The provider has appropriate procedures in place to support her in working with staff to evaluate their daily practice. This enables them to recognise any weaknesses and to make further improvements in the provision for children.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the nursery used for the registered Early Years childcare.
- The inspector talked with the provider about the toys, resources and equipment that are used for childcare and viewed some of these.

The inspector talked with the provider about her understanding of the requirements
for safeguarding and welfare and learning and development and how these are met when childcare is provided.

- The inspector looked at policies and documents that are used when caring for children and discussed self-evaluation and improvement plans.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and training of the provider and of their childcare staff.

Information about the setting

Thornhill Nursery was registered in 2014 and is on the Early Years Register. It is located within Thornhill Primary School in Houghton Regis, Bedfordshire. It is managed by Thornhill Primary School Governing Body and maintains close links with the host school. The nursery serves the local area and is accessible to all children. It operates from one main room and there is an enclosed area available for outdoor play. There are currently three staff working directly with the children. Of these, one holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 2 and two hold qualifications at level 3 or above, including one with Qualified Teacher Status. The nursery opens Monday to Friday during term time only. The provision is for children aged two years. Sessions are from 1.30pm to 3.30pm. Children attend for a variety of sessions. There are currently six children on roll but there were no children present attending the registered Early Years provision at the time of inspection . The nursery receives funding for the provision of free early education for two-year-old children. It receives support from the local authority.

Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

The Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted) regulates and inspects to achieve excellence in the care of children and young people, and in education and skills for learners of all ages. It regulates and inspects childcare and children's social care, and inspects the Children and Family Court Advisory Support Service (Cafcass), schools, colleges, initial teacher training, work-based learning and skills training, adult and community learning, and education and training in prisons and other secure establishments.
