## Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Yvonne Johnson, monitored your provision on 03/09/2014 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

## **Outcome of monitoring**

As a result of our inspection on 28/04/2014, we sent you a welfare requirements notice. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

The welfare requirements notice required you to comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirements: Suitable People; Safety and suitability of premises; Staff qualifications, training and support; Information and records and Learning and development. The steps you were required to take were detailed in full in the notice sent to you on 8 May 2014. Previous monitoring visits, completed on 15 May 2014 and 10 June 2014, found that you had taken prompt and effective action and were complying with the requirements of this notice.

During the monitoring visit of 3 September 2014 the inspector discussed with you how you have ensured that you can maintain the improvements required by the welfare requirements notice and notice to improve. She observed interaction between staff and children throughout the nursery. The inspector also spoke to you and individual members of staff. There had been no input from the local authority advisor since the last visit.

The inspector found that you had continued to maintain the progress made on the issues relating to health and safety and the environment for children. You have taken local authority advice and re-organised the nursery rooms to provide better access to equipment which stimulates the children to play with greater independence. The internal decoration has been improved to provide a lighter, more welcoming environment, and parents have commented positively about this in feedback.





Children's play outdoors has been enhanced by the introduction of a role play area where children can use and develop their imagination.

Staff are clear about planning and assessment of children and how this will be used to provide individual experiences for each child. Documentation is in place to support this and partnership with parents.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the setting has taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

## **Next steps**

The next step will be a full inspection.
