#### The provision meets requirements

# Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector held discussions with the manager and staff, including about how they safeguard children.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including the medication, accident records and the children's registration and attendance records.
- The inspector viewed both the inside and outside areas of the setting available to children who are cared for.

The inspector held the leadership and management meeting with the manager and operations manager and discussed with the manager how she evaluates and

# **Full report**

#### Information about the setting

Bobcats Playsafe Club registered in 2014. It is one of a number of privately owned nurseries and clubs owned by Jancett Childcare and JACE Training Limited. It operates from a classroom within Banstead Community Junior School, in Banstead, Surrey. The club provides after school care. It is open each weekday from 3.30pm to 6.30pm, during term time only. All children have access to an enclosed outdoor play area. The club is registered on the Early Years Register and both the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There are currently no children on roll in the Early Years Foundation Stage age group. The club employs three members of staff. Two of these staff, including the manager hold appropriate early years qualifications. One member of staff is working towards a play work qualification at level 3.

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# Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
