## Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Mandy Mooney, monitored your provision on 22/09/2014 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

## **Outcome of monitoring**

As a result of our inspection on 01/05/2014, we sent you a welfare requirements notice. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

The welfare requirements notice required you to comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirements: Child Protection, premises; information and records and changes that must be notified to Ofsted. A notice to improve was also issued under the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage relating to the learning and development requirements. The steps you were required to take were detailed in full in the notice sent to you on 27 May 2014. A previous monitoring visit, completed on 27 June 2014, found that you had not taken prompt and effective action and you were not complying with the requirements of this notice.

During the monitoring visit of 22 September 2014, the inspector was not able to discuss with you the steps you had taken to make improvements as you were unable to attend the setting. The inspector discussed with your manager the steps you have taken to address the actions raised in the notices. She observed interaction between staff and children throughout the setting and the inspector also spoke to individual members of staff and to the children. She looked at your planning, your self-evaluation, DBS records, some staff records and your safeguarding policies and procedures.





The inspector found that you have developed an action plan to address the issues raised at your last inspection and have introduced systems to evaluate the quality of practice and the impact this has on outcomes for children. This has enabled you to identify how to address the areas for improvement identified at your last inspection and to plan for ongoing improvement. You have notified Ofsted of a change of manager as required.

Staff are communicating better with parents. Systems for sharing information with parents include notice boards and discussions about the activities children are taking part in and the policies and procedures that underpin your practices. You have developed a system for enabling parents and children to contribute to how the setting is run and you have implemented a comment and questionnaire system. Parents now have more opportunities to be involved in their child's learning and are encouraged to extend this at home.

Although a representative from the local authority did not attend the visit, the manager explained that you have been working with them to make changes to improve the quality of the provision. You have sent a number of staff on a range of training courses to improve their knowledge and skills in specific areas, including safeguarding and those staff who are not yet appropriately qualified in childcare or play work are enrolled on appropriate courses. The inspector found that staff were happier and more confident about their roles and responsibilities and they were able to articulate a sound knowledge of how to safeguard children and how to meet their needs; for example, through their more secure knowledge of child protection issues and procedures and through more embedded practices relating to the drop off and collection procedures in place using walkie talkies.

Staff are planning more effectively to meet the needs of the children; ensuring they consider the resources needed and how the space can be used better and the children are contributing their ideas for activities, which they engage well in. Children are developing nice friendships and they behave well. This is because staff provide a positive role model for them.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that at this time you have taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.
