The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge of how to plan appropriate activities across the seven areas of learning. The childminder demonstrates her understanding of how to track children's progress to support her in identifying children's individual needs and next steps in learning.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure knowledge and understanding of how to safeguard children and protect them from harm and abuse.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of developing her knowledge and understanding and is able to demonstrate an ability to evaluate her own practice. She understands the importance of seeking and using comments from parents to inform her plans for future improvements.
- The childminder demonstrates that she values partnership working with parents and other professionals involved in the child's life to fully meet their individual needs and to support continuity in their learning and development.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to promote children's health. She explains the importance of teaching children good hygiene through daily routines and providing them with everyday opportunities to have physical exercise and fresh air.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the rooms where children play and the toys and resources available.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other adults in the household, and all recent training certificates.
- The inspector looked at relevant policies and procedures.

The childminder was registered in 2011 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She operates all year round from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.
