Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Elizabeth Patricia Edmond, monitored your provision on 29/05/2014 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of monitoring

As a result of our inspection on 24/04/2014, we sent you a welfare requirements notice. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

The welfare requirements notice required you to comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirements: Safeguarding, Suitable people, Staff: child ratios, Managing Behaviour, Safety and Suitability of Premises, Environment and Equipment, Medicines. Additionally the notice to improve required you comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirements: The Learning and Development requirements, in relation to planning and quality of teaching, staff supervision and learning about healthy lifestyles.

During the monitoring visit of 29 May 2014 the inspector discussed with the steps you had taken to address the actions raised in the notice to improve and you advised that you had just received your actions letter in the post that morning. You were able to demonstrate that you had begun to renew Disclosure and Barring Service checks for all staff and the inspector saw on your computer that some were showing as clear. You explained how you had revised your procedures for regularly checking sleeping babies but there were no sleeping babies at that time. Therefore it was difficult to establish the effectiveness of the revised procedures.

You pointed out, to the inspector, the hazards that had been identified at your inspection and you showed the measures you had put in place to remedy the matter. The inspector saw where you had covered some damaged flooring with strong tape





and checked that small items had been removed from the babies' play area. You showed the inspector the children's medication sheets and where the parents have now signed to confirm their permission for administration. The inspector did not see any evidence that children had not had their noses wiped.

You had contacted your local authority and booked training for staff to support their skills in managing children's behaviour. Your prompt liaison with the local authority has enabled you to enlist their support in relation to planning for children's individual learning needs. However, the support visits and training for staff had, at that time, not taken place. Therefore the inspector was unable to establish the effectiveness of this.

The inspector checked your daily attendance registers and counted the children and staff present. The inspector was able to confirm that you were meeting the required adult-to-child ratios.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the setting has taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

Next steps

The next step will be further monitoring.
