Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Elizabeth Patricia Edmond, monitored your provision on 15/07/2014 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of monitoring

As a result of our inspection on 24/04/2014, we sent you a welfare requirements notice. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

The welfare requirements notice required you to comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirements: Safeguarding, Suitable people, Staff: child ratios, Managing Behaviour, Safety and Suitability of Premises, Environment and Equipment, Medicines. Additionally the notice to improve required you comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirements: The Learning and Development requirements, in relation to planning and quality of teaching, supervision and healthy lifestyles.

During the monitoring visit of the 15 July 2014 the inspector discussed with you the steps you had taken to address the actions raised in the notice to improve. You were able to demonstrate that you have renewed Disclosure and Barring Service checks for all staff. Your central record of this was clearly displayed in the office. You have revised your procedures for regularly checking sleeping babies; this procedure was demonstrated and observed by the inspector at the visit. Babies' health and safety is now effectively monitored. You showed the inspector that wiping children's noses had been made a priority by adding this to your 'Golden Rules' on the notice board and you explained that staff were following this.

You had arranged training for staff which is supporting their skills in managing children's behaviour and staff's understanding of safeguarding children. The





inspector was able to observe the success of this in relation to some staff members. Other staff described the training they had attended. The inspector spoke to every member of staff present about who they would contact if they were concerned about the welfare of any child. Each member of staff was able to explain who they would contact and they knew where the relevant contact numbers were displayed.

You have liaised effectively with your local authority to revise the way that you plan for children's learning. This means that children's individual learning needs can be more effectively addressed. You have also begun to monitor and moderate the quality of teaching by carrying out staff observations. You were able to show the inspector your records of staff observations and explained how you are beginning to use them improve learning outcomes for children.

The inspector also checked your daily attendance registers and counted the children and staff present. This confirmed that you were meeting the required adult-to-child ratios.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the setting has taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

Next steps

The next step will be a full inspection.
