## **The quality and standards of the early years provision**

### **The provision does not meet requirements**

- The childminder is not complying with all of the safeguarding and welfare requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She does not hold a valid first aid qualification. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder is aware of the learning and development requirements, and how implementing these, supports children's learning. She is able to offer ample space for children to play, using a wide variety of resources to promote their learning and enjoyment.
- The childminder has a range of policies and documentation in place to support her in promoting children's well-being and welfare. These include safeguarding and behaviour management.
- The childminder has a sound awareness of the benefits of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to meet children's care and learning needs.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable understanding of her strengths and areas of future development. She has completed all of the actions and recommendations made at her last inspection. This demonstrates her suitable commitment to continuous improvement.

## Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder relating to her future practice when caring for early years age children.
- The inspector looked at areas of the home the childminder will use for childminding, and sampled relevant documentation.
- The inspector observed the range of resources available, and discussed activities the childminder aims to provide for children.

### Information about the setting

The childminder registered in 1992. She lives with her husband and two adult sons, in the borough of Sutton. All areas on the ground floor, apart from the front room, are available for childminding. There is a fully enclosed garden for outdoor play. The childminder is registered on the Early Years Register and both the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. The childminder currently minds school age children only. There are no early years age children on roll.

### What the setting needs to do to improve further

**To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:**

- complete paediatric first aid relevant for workers caring for young children and where relevant, babies

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## Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
