Overall outcome	Unmet independent school standards identified

Reason for the inspection

- The inspection was undertaken by Ofsted at the request of the Department for Education, following concerns that the school may not be meeting some of the requirements of the standards for registration. The Department for Education requested that the inspection should focus on the following standards for registration:
 - Part 1: The quality of education provided
 - Part 3: The welfare, health and safety of pupils.
- The inspection was conducted without notice.

Main findings

- Leaders are not working effectively enough to ensure the welfare, health and safety of pupils. There are a number of shortcomings that need to be addressed. Leaders do not always follow the school's procedures in relation to the sharing of safeguarding information with the local authority. For example, there have been alleged inappropriate incidents between students reported on site and leaders have not always followed the correct procedures in informing the local authority.
- School leaders do not record incidents involving the welfare, health and safety of students in sufficient detail. A number of incident forms have missing information. Leaders find it difficult to find information about historical safeguarding incidents because filing systems are inefficient; particularly information which has been received electronically from other agencies.
- The school has assigned a designated officer to lead on safeguarding issues, as it is required to do. This is the headteacher. However, her training for this role is not up to date.
- During the inspection, students under the age of 16 were found smoking cigarettes at break time, in the grounds of the school. This demonstrates that staff are not protecting the welfare and health of students well enough. The school's incident records indicate that students have brought cigarettes into school, on a number of occasions. This demonstrates that the school's behaviour policy, and its implementation by staff, is not effective enough.
- The school successfully implements its anti-bullying policy. Students have a good understanding of the different types of bullying, and what constitutes bullying. All students spoken to during the inspection reported confidently that bullying was not a problem in the school.
- The school continues to meet all standards in Part 1: The quality of education provided. There is evidence that students typically engage in over 20 hours of supervised, and appropriate, educational activity each week. Discussions with students, staff, and carers accompanying children from their care homes, indicate that students are fully supervised during lessons.
- There is evidence that students make reasonable progress in their academic development, and in improving their behaviour.

The school must take action to meet schedule 1 of The Education (Independent School Standards) (England) Regulations 2010, as amended by the Education (Independent School Standards) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2012 ('the independent school standards') and associated requirements.

- Ashmeads School, which opened in 2007, is situated near Kettering, in Northamptonshire.
- The school provides full-time education for up to 12 boys and girls, aged 11 to 17 years, who experience behavioural, emotional and social difficulties.
- The majority of the students are in public care and four have statements of special educational needs.
- There are 11 students on roll, funded by nine different local authorities.
- The school summarises its aims as, 'providing a positive and nurturing environment to support the growth and achievement of every child'.
- The school was last inspected in May 2013.
