## **This inspection**

This is the first inspection following registration. At this interim inspection the home was '**not judged**'.

The home has not provided accommodation to children and young people since its registration on 18 July 2014. This inspection focuses on whether the children's home meets its statutory requirements in order to maintain its registration and is ready to accept placements.

The home has all relevant systems and administration records in place should a placement be made. There is a staff team who are currently working at other home's within this organisation and will be deployed to this home when young people are accommodated.

There are no outstanding repairs and all relevant health and safety procedures and certificates of appliances checks are in place.

This home meets its statutory requirements in order to maintain its registration and is ready to accept placements.

## **Information about this children's home**

This is a privately run children's home which provides accommodation for three young people with emotional and behavioural difficulties.
