The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- Staff have a secure understanding of safeguarding children. They understand the importance of supervising children and risk assessing the areas they use to make sure they are safe. Staff know the procedures to follow if they have concerns about a child.
- Staff know how to promote children's health and well-being. Staff provide healthy snacks and opportunities for children to have regular exercise.
- Staff know how to plan activities that include children's interests and support their continued learning.
- Staff understand the importance of sharing information with parents to support children's care and learning.
- The manager and staff review practice by including parents and children in the evaluation process to help the setting to improve.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector carried out observations of staff interacting with older children within the computer suite and in the main hall.
- The inspector looked at a sample of policies and procedures, including safeguarding, complaints and behaviour management.
- The inspector held discussions with the manager and staff regarding safeguarding practice.
- The inspector held discussions with the manager and staff regarding how they support children in the Early Years Foundation Stage when they are present, who also attend school.
- The inspector spoke to parents, staff and children.

Information about the setting

Bromley Mytime at St.Vincent's is registered as one of the Mytime groups. The group operates from St.Vincent's Primary School, which is situated in a residential area of Mottingham, in the London Borough of Bromley. It has use of the main school hall and adjoining library, a computer suite and an additional classroom if needed. There are separate toilet facilities for boys and girls and an outdoor playground. The group is open during term time only from 3.15pm to 6pm and is available to children who attend the school. The group is registered on the Early Years Register and compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There were no children present within the early years age group on the day of the inspection. The group employs two permanent members of staff, who both hold a qualification at level 2. The manager has a qualification at level 3.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
