### The quality and standards of the early years provision

# The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how she will plan and provide activities to engage children and to promote their learning and development. She has a sound knowledge of the learning and development requirements and how she will deliver them.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to protect children in her care and has clear child protection procedures that she would follow. She has a secure knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements and how she will meet them.
- The childminder understands that assessments of children's learning, including a progress check between the age of two and three years, must be undertaken in partnership with parents.
- The childminder has procedures for keeping and maintaining confidential information on the children. This includes records of any accidents, administration of any medication and details of children's individual needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other early years settings that children attend. She is aware of the value of providing appropriate and consistent care for the children to support their well-being.
- The childminder provides a warm and friendly environment. Toys and resources are of good quality and children can easily choose them. The childminder discusses how she will use the environment and resources to help children to learn and attract their interest.

# **Information about this inspection**

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the learning and development requirements for early years children.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder plans to undertake children's assessments and plan challenging activities.
- The inspector examined documentation, evidence of the suitability of household members and discussed the childminder's safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector looked at the equipment and resources and discussed how the childminder plans to use them in supporting children's learning and development.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that the childminder plans to use for childminding.

## Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 1992 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her husband and three adult children, in a house in Harlow. The whole of the home will be used for childminding. The childminder attends a toddler group and activities at the local children's centre. She visits the shops and park on a regular basis. The childminder takes children to and collects children from the local schools and pre-schools. The childminder operates all year round, from 6.30am to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays. At the time of inspection, there were no children on roll in the early years age group.

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#### Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

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and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
