## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The manager has significant knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. Therefore, all required documentation and procedures are in place to help ensure that staff meet children's care and learning needs, and their emotional well-being.
- The manager and staff have attended child protection training. They demonstrate a good knowledge and understanding of how to keep children safe, and procedures to follow should they be concerned regarding the welfare of children in their care.
- The manager and staff organise an environment that is welcoming and safe, and has stimulating resources to engage children's interests.
- The manager demonstrates a good understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to ensure that they meet children's individual needs.
- The manager has effective systems for self-evaluation that inform the setting's priorities and are used to set targets for improvement.
- All staff suitability checks are in place, with the provider initiating one-to-one supervision meetings to ensure that they support staff's professional development and training needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and the areas used by the children.
- The inspector discussed with the manager how they intend to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and qualifications of staff working with children.
- The inspector viewed documentation including a sample of children's records, policies and development plans.

South Avenue Club was registered in 2008. It operates from a detached single-storey building on the premises of South Avenue County Infant School, Sittingbourne in Kent. There is ramped disability access to the building. All children access outdoor play using the school playground and field. Children attend the club and holiday play scheme from the host school and surrounding area. There is provision for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities, and those who speak English as an additional language. The club is registered on the Early Years Register, and the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. There were no children of early years age present on the day of the inspection. The club opens five days a week during school term times from 7.30am to 9am and from 3.15pm until 6pm, and from 8am to 6pm in school holidays. There are three staff, of whom all hold a National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) at level 3.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.
