Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The leadership and management of the setting is strong, with clear and detailed policies and good safeguarding practice. This underpins children's well-being.
- Children with disabilities benefit from consistent relationships with key staff who promote children's independence very well.
- All children have a wide choice of interesting activities to choose from, meaning that they are always engaged in purposeful play.
- Staff build strong partnerships with schools and parents which means that information is appropriately shared in support of children's care.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector and manager discussed how the setting meets the needs of children in the early years age range.
- The inspector examined a range of documentation including policies and staff files.
- The inspector observed older children at play in different play areas in the setting.

Extratime @ Woodingdean registered in 2008. It operates from an annexe building and part of Ash Cottage, in the Woodingdean area of Brighton and Hove. The setting operates as an after-school playwork provision and as a holiday play-scheme. The setting supports a number of children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. The setting opens five days a week during term-time from 3.15pm to 5.30pm. The setting is also open during the Easter and Summer holidays. The setting is registered on the Early Years Register and on the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There are currently 29 children on roll, with two in the early years age group. The setting also offers care to children aged over eight years. There is a staff team of nine, including the manager, seven of whom have completed early years or playwork training.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.
