The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a sound understanding of how to meet the learning and development requirements. She understands how to support children to enjoy activities that challenge and promote learning in all areas. She understands the benefits of working in partnership with parents and other agencies to meet children's specific needs.
- The childminder keeps the documentation required for the safe management of the provision and to promote children's welfare.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of her role and responsibilities to safeguard the children's welfare. She knows how to provide a welcoming environment. She keeps the premises safe and understands the procedures to follow should she have a safeguarding concern.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment towards continually improving her provision and has met the action set at her last inspection. The childminder's first-aid certificate and public liability insurance are up to date.
- The childminder meets the requirements of the Childcare Register.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

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Inspection activities

■ The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge of the safeguarding and welfare, and learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

- The inspector viewed the areas of the home that children have access to when they are present. She viewed the policies and resources available for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she evaluates her practice to drive improvement.

The childminder registered in 2012. She lives with her husband in the Camberwell area of the London Borough of Southwark. The premises are within walking distance of local schools, shops, parks and local transport links. Children have access to the ground floor of the property, which includes a play room and garden for outdoor play. The childminder is registered on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There were no children of early years age on roll at the time of the inspection.
