# **Summary of key findings for parents**

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a sound understanding of the learning and development requirements. She has suitable systems ready to monitor, assess and plan for children's progress.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to promote children's good health and well-being. She holds a current first aid qualification and plans to gather appropriate information about children to meet their individual needs.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. She risk assesses her premises to enable her to provide a safe environment for children. The childminder knows how to report any concerns she may have about a child.
- The childminder is friendly and aims to provide a welcoming service. She understands the importance of working effectively in partnership with parents and other early years settings to meet children's care and learning needs.
- The childminder has met the actions set at her last inspection. She attends relevant training courses to update her knowledge and skills to help her continue to improve her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

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### **Inspection activities**

■ The inspector spoke with the childminder about her understanding of the safeguarding and welfare, and learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

- The inspector viewed resources and looked around the areas of the premises available for children.

The childminder registered in 2005. She lives with her partner and three children in the Abbey Wood area of the Royal Borough of Greenwich. The premises are within walking distance of local schools, shops, parks and local transport links. Children have access to the ground floor of the property, including a garden for outdoor play. The childminder is registered on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There were no children on roll in the early years age group at the time of the inspection.
