The setting does not meet legal requirements for early years settings

Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- Information gathered from observations and assessments is not used effectively to inform planning. This means educational programmes do not provide children with suitable levels of challenge that support their continuing development.
- The childminder does not always consider the differing ways children learn, in order to inform planning and ensure that teaching fully supports children to make the best progress given their starting points.
- Children's health and well-being are not fully supported as the childminder has not ensured the contents of her first-aid box is stocked appropriately for use with children.
- The childminder ensures that ratios are maintained appropriately and documentation is in place to show how this is managed to support children's welfare.
- The childminder demonstrates a sound knowledge of child protection procedures approved by the Local Safeguarding Children Board. She fully understands her responsibility to protect the welfare of any children in her care.
- The childminder demonstrates that she is aware of the value of exchanging information with parents, carers and other providers to promote continuity of care and learning for each child and to help them to feel settled and secure in their surroundings.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

- improve systems to monitor the delivery of educational programmes and children's development, through the use of an accurate assessment of each child's skills, abilities and progress
- develop knowledge and understanding of the different ways that children learn, in order to reflect on these when planning and observing activities, to ensure that teaching is effective in promoting children's learning and development
- review the content of the first-aid box, to ensure this is stocked with appropriate items for use with children in the event of an accident or injury.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about how she delivers the early years educational programme.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her procedures for safeguarding children.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed and looked at toys, books, resources and equipment that she uses in the indoor and outdoor areas.
- The inspector checked essential documentation, including policies, procedures and registers of attendance.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she monitors and evaluates her practice.
