Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates secure knowledge of safeguarding issues and keeps her premises safe through regular safety checks. She has appropriate procedures in place to promote children's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to plan a range of activities for children across the seven areas of learning. She describes how she adapts tasks to meet the needs of children and monitors their learning and development.
- The childminder provides a wide variety of toys set out so children can choose freely.
- The childminder describes how she takes children to the local park, playgroups and the library. She understands how this teaches children about their community and develops their communication, language and social skills further.
- The childminder understands the value of developing partnerships with parents. She keeps them informed about their children's learning and development, which helps to promote education at home.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled children's observations, planning and assessment and registration records.
- The inspector held conversation with the childminder throughout the inspection.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's suitability, qualifications, policies and procedures.
- The inspector checked the premises, equipment and toys available for children.

The childminder registered in 2001. She lives with her husband and their three children in the London Borough of Haringey. They live in a first floor two-storey maisonette close to the local park and a playground. The premises are accessed by a flight of stairs. The whole of the first floor with the exception of the front room is used for childminding purposes. The childminder is registered on the Early Years Register and on both the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. The childminder holds CASHE Level 3 in children and young people's workforce qualification. At the time of inspection, there were no children present.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.

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
