## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of how to implement the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She understands the importance of observing children and assessing their progress in order to plan for the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder has a good understanding of providing suitable resources and play experiences to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder is aware of how to promote healthy lifestyles which support children's well-being effectively.
- The childminder has a secure awareness of how to safeguard children in her care. She understands the procedures to follow if she was concerned about a child. In addition, she is aware of safety in the home and outdoors, to protect children's well-being further.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to meet the individual needs of children and how she delivers a suitable range of play experiences.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents that the childminder will use.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she safeguards children in her care.

- The inspector viewed the areas children will use.
