Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to identify and report any safeguarding concerns she may have. She knows to complete detailed risk assessments, so that all hazards are removed. This helps to promote children's welfare and well-being.
- The childminder knows her responsibilities in meeting the safeguarding and welfare and learning and development requirements. She understands the importance of obtaining all relevant consent forms from parents.
- The childminder knows how to work with parents. She understands the importance of sharing children's progress and achievements and exchanges daily information.
- The childminder understands how to promote outcomes for children. She knows to undertake further training. For example, she has completed safeguarding training and is booked to renew her first aid.
- The childminder knows how to provide children with a variety of resources to promote their next steps in learning.
- The childminder has knowledge of how to promote diversity with children. She has a range of resources reflecting differences including books, dolls and puzzles.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's development to identify any gaps in learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the required documentation with the childminder.
- The inspector looked at the areas of the home the childminder uses for childminding.
- The inspector had discussions with the childminder of her knowledge of safeguarding and promoting children's welfare, and the learning and development requirements.

The childminder registered in 2009. She lives in Romford, Havering. The whole of the ground floor is used for childminding and there is a fully enclosed garden for outside play. The childminder is registered on the Early Years Register and both the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There were no children on roll at the time of the inspection.
