There were no children present when this inspection took place. Stowting Montessori Nursery registered in 2009. It opens Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 3.30pm during term times. The provision is registered on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. There are four members of staff, of whom three hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3. It adopts a Montessori approach to teaching. The nursery is in receipt of early education funding for children aged two, three and four years.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.
