## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of safeguarding issues and keeps her premises safe and suitable for children. She uses a range of procedures to help promote children's welfare.
- The childminder demonstrates knowledge and understanding of children's learning and development. She makes sure children learn through play and have free access to age-appropriate resources.
- The childminder values children's health and works with parents to promote a healthy lifestyle at home and at her setting.
- The childminder knows how to promote good behaviour. She role-models good behaviour and encourages children to be polite and respect each other.
- The childminder understands the value of partnerships with parents. She keeps them informed about their children's learning and development to provide consistency in their education at home and at her setting.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder relating to safeguarding, self-evaluation, learning and development, and care practices.
- The inspector sampled documentation relating to children's care and learning.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's suitability, her qualifications, and her policies and procedures.
- The inspector checked the safety of the premises and the garden.
