Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the learning and development requirements in order to meet children's needs.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to develop and deliver the educational programmes to promote children's learning.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to identify children's starting points, to observe and assess their progress, and to plan learning experiences to meet their individual needs.
- The childminder has a fair understanding of how to offer an inclusive service. As a result, she will make her home welcoming and offer children healthy meals and snacks.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of safeguarding issues and how to carry out risk assessments in the home and outdoors.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of child protection issues and knows who to contact in the event of a concern.
- The childminder's process of evaluating her service is effective and helps her to strive for continuous improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
