Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good knowledge and understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She implements this through her effective policies and procedures, risk assessments, further training, and through her partnership with parents.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to safeguard children. She is aware of the procedures to follow should she have a concern about a child's welfare. The childminder has completed safeguarding children training.
- The childminder has completed relevant first-aid training and understands how to respond if medical emergencies arise.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health, safety and well-being. She has effective systems for recording any accidents that occur and any medication administered. The childminder knows the importance of providing children with regular opportunities for outdoor play and exercise.
- The childminder understands the need to provide a broad range of toys and resources to promote children's learning.
- The childminder understands how to observe children's achievements, assess their progress and plan for children's future progress regardless of their ages, abilities or backgrounds. She ensures that she discusses children's starting points on entry to her provision and knows the importance of planning for their interests.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice to secure continuous improvement of it.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
