Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates, through discussion, a clear understanding of how to promote children's good health. She understands the benefits of providing children with good opportunities to enjoy fresh air and exercise in order to develop their physical skills and a healthy lifestyle.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable understanding of how to provide a range of activities and experiences to support children in their learning and development.
- The childminder discussed how she will ensure children's safety in her home and when on outings through identifying and addressing any potential hazards.
- The childminder discussed the importance of working in partnership with parents. She has suitable arrangements to exchange information with parents and others involved in children's care.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to safeguard children and of child protection procedures. She knows what to do if she has concerns about a child in her care and the procedures to follow.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to continuous improvement through reflection, self-evaluation and attending relevant training.
- The childminder has improved her knowledge of observation and assessment. Consequently, she understands how to plan children's progression based on their individual abilities and knows to share this information with parents.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector looked at policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
