## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is able to protect the well-being of the children as she has attended safeguarding training. She has good knowledge of signs that would cause concern and of the appropriate reporting procedures. The childminder limits hazards to children by completing and implementing detailed risk assessments in order to help keep children safe.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the learning and development requirements of The Early Years Foundation Stage. She provides a range of age-appropriate resources and activities, which help to promote children's learning in all areas. She has good techniques for observing children, tracking their development and planning their next steps of learning.
- The childminder establishes strong partnerships with parents through sharing information daily and by using link books, which involve parents in their children's future learning plans.
- The childminder reflects on her practice by using tools, such as the self-evaluation form, which allow her to identify strengths and address any weaknesses. She works with other professionals and makes use of their views to help make continuous improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector sampled documents, such as policies and risk assessments.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will deliver educational programmes.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her role and responsibilities in safeguarding children.
