Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a range of documentation to support her practice. She is able to gather information in relation to children's individual needs to enable her to begin to plan for their care and education.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning to enable her to assess and track their progress. She has a good variety of toys and resources to promote all areas of learning.
- The premises are safe and secure because risk assessments are completed and any identified hazards are minimised. The childminder holds a suitable first-aid qualification so she is able to provide assistance in the event of a minor accident.
- The childminder understands safeguarding issues to promote children's safety and welfare. She has a sound knowledge of the possible signs and symptoms of abuse that would cause concern, and knows how to report her concerns. Additionally, she has considered the safe use of mobile phones and cameras as part of her robust safeguarding procedures.
- The childminder demonstrates her awareness of the importance of working in partnership with parents, other providers and schools to complement the children's care and learning needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled the available documentation that the childminder plans to use.
- The inspector looked around the areas of the home and the toys, equipment and resources available for children's use, and discussed risk assessment methods.
- The inspector discussed the process of self-evaluation, including establishing whether the childminder has addressed previous actions and recommendations from the last inspection.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage, and how to plan for and assess children's progress.
