Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder shared how she will support children's learning. She can offer a good range of activities and resources that are age appropriate to promote children's progress based on their learning needs.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being. She will provide a healthy and well balanced diet and ensure that children enjoy daily fresh air and exercise. She understands the importance of how to manage and promote children's behaviour in a positive way.
- The childminder demonstrates a sound understanding of safeguarding children to help protect them from harm. She has appropriate policies and paperwork to promote children's welfare, including a complaints policy to share with parents.
- The childminder shows a sound understanding of valuing diversity and providing an inclusive service for children and families. She has appropriate methods to engage parents and encourage them to share what they know about their children. She recognises the importance of finding out about children's care routines when they first attend and to keep parents informed of their children's achievements.
- The childminder is fully committed to continuous improvement. She demonstrates a suitable understanding of regularly evaluating her service in order to make improvements to benefit children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector observed areas of the home used for childminding and talked to the childminder about her understanding of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements and the systems to keep children safe.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation such as the childminder's self - evaluation, her policies and procedures.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability of the childminder, including relevant first-aid training.
