Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a sound knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She demonstrates a good understanding of how to use this to support children's individual needs.
- The childminder has a very good understanding of safeguarding. A robust range of policies and procedures support her practice in keeping children safe and protected from harm.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to promote children's safety and welfare. For example, she uses a good range of risk assessments and safety equipment, such as cupboard locks, to ensure the premises are secure and children are kept safe.
- The childminder understands how to support and promote children's physical well-being. She demonstrates that children are provided with daily opportunities to fresh air and exercise, and are provided with a choice of healthy snacks and meals.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of working in partnership with parents and other providers. She talks confidently about strategies she would adopt to support consistency in children's learning and development at home and within other settings.
- The childminder ensures that her mandatory training is kept up to date. She talks about using additional training to enhance the provision and support the needs of the children.
- The childminder understands how to support children in their preparation for moving to school. For example, providing them with opportunities to develop independence and self-help skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
