The setting meets legal requirements for early years settings

Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a wide range of resources to meet the learning and development needs of children aged from babies to school age.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear knowledge of the areas of learning. She understands the requirements for completing assessments on children and for supporting their progress through indoor and outdoor play activities and practical experiences.
- The childminder discussed the importance of working in partnership with parents and any other early years providers who may care for children. She has suitable arrangements to exchange information with them about children's progress and individual needs.
- The childminder's has a secure knowledge and understanding of the welfare requirements. She knows how to act on concerns about a child's welfare, carry out effective risk assessments, promote good health and teach children safety rules.
- The childminder demonstrates a good capacity to continually improve. Since the last inspection the she has achieved a level 3 qualification and attended various other shorter courses. She has met all actions and recommendations previously set.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and how she will meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at the policies and procedures, records and documentation the childminder has for use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked documentation relating to the suitability of the childminder and other adults living in the household.
- The inspector looked at photographs of past attending children engaged in activities within the childminder's home, and checked the suitability of the premises including play resources.
