## Summary of key findings for parents

## The provision meets requirements

- The childminder and her assistant have a sound knowledge about child protection issues. They know the procedures to follow should they have concerns about the children in their care.
- The childminder understands how to plan interesting, suitable activities across the required areas of learning. She knows how to use observation and assessment to plan for children's progress from their starting points on entry.
- The childminder and her assistant understand how to promote the well-being of children to maintain their safety, such as through daily visual checks, risk assessment and regular fire drills.
- The childminder plans to maintain children's good health by providing daily opportunities for children to play outside and to eat wholesome meals and snacks.
- The childminder is clear about the importance of securing a strong link with parents and relevant professionals to support children's emotional well-being and their learning and development.
- The childminder is clear about the need to seek to improve her provision through obtaining the views of parents, children and those of her assistant, and by accessing relevant training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector looked at the premises, play equipment and toys available for childminding purposes.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's observation and assessment methods and how she plans to meet the learning and development requirements, and the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed what documents and records the childminder keeps when minding.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's self-evaluation methods and policies.
