Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage, and plans activities based around children's individual interests and stage of development. She observes children in their play and plans for their future learning. She is confident in seeking advice to address any gaps in their development.
- The childminder has completed safeguarding training and has suitable understanding of the indicators that would cause concern and the reporting procedures. Therefore, she is able to protect children's well-being. The childminder limits hazards to children by carrying out risk assessments indoors and outside to help keep children safe.
- The childminder enhances her childcare knowledge by attending regular training. This has positive impacts on the children's care and learning as she implements new ideas in order to meet their needs more effectively. The childminder uses a wide range of resources which help her to promote children's learning in all areas.
- The childminder establishes good links with local schools the children also attend. She extends learning from school by incorporating targets set by teachers into activities at her home. The childminder forms effective relationships with parents and shares information with them daily. She uses the views of parents and children to make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked the suitability of the childminder and other household members.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder, her role and responsibilities in safeguarding children.
- The inspector sampled documents, such as policies, risk assessments and information held about the children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder, how she meets the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
