## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The management and staff have a sound knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements. They demonstrate a good awareness of how to plan a wide range of challenging learning experiences to support children's overall progress.
- Staff create a welcoming and stimulating environment for children. There is a good choice of toys and resources available to suit all ages of children and ensure they learn through play.
- Staff ensure children are happy and emotionally secure at the club. They group children effectively with key persons into small groups. This enables staff to build good relationships and to get to know the individual children well.
- Staff understand how to promote children's well-being. They demonstrate that they provide children with a choice of healthy snacks and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- Staff demonstrate how they promote children's safety and welfare. For example, they ensure that risk assessments of the premises are carried out each day and that the building is kept secure to promote children's safety.
- The management and staff are committed to safeguarding children. They have attended relevant training and know what procedures to follow should they have any concerns. This helps to protect children's welfare.
- The systems for self-evaluation are effective and monitoring of the club is robust. Staff understand the importance of partnership working. They demonstrate how they would work closely with parents and the local schools to enable them to continually improve children's learning experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed all areas of the setting and the range of toys, equipment and resources available for children in the early years age group.
- The inspector held discussions with the provider and staff regarding their knowledge and understanding of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector looked at and discussed a range of records, including children's details, learning information, written policies, self-evaluation form and a selection of other documents with the provider and staff.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability and qualifications of staff working with children.

Kidz Zone Out of School Club was registered in 2002. The club employs nine members of staff. Of these, five hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3 and three at level 2. The club opens Monday to Friday from 8am until 9am and from 3pm until 6pm, term time. It also operates during the school holidays from 8am until 6pm.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.

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
